Recommended harddisk space requirements for CD VERSION: 150 MB or more free if you wish to load all available Bible translations.

This space is needed for Windows swap file which grows according to number of Bible versions loaded and number of opened files. You can save space by loading only those Bible versions you need for immediate study. Use with screen reading software

Theophilos should be able to work with most screen reader systems. One of the most popular of them is Jaws for Windows from Henter-Joyce (www.hj.com). We have contacted Henter-Joyce to test Theophilos with their system and it has been found compatible with Jaws for Windows (JFW). The makers of Jaws have included additional special support for Theophilos directly into their latest release of the product so you will not need to install any additional scripts.

Many of our users who use this reader system are already enjoying the power and ease of use of Theophilos Bible Software. While there is no other software necessary to use Theophilos with screen reading systems, if you are a Jaws for Windows user you can take the full advantage of the built-in support for Theophilos. This will make your study experience even more enjoyable and offer you a better control of the program in Jaws for Windows. If you find Theophilos a little intimidating with the wealth of functions and features the built-in support will introduce Theophilos to you and teach you to use it in the most effective way. Please note that you must have Jaws for Windows version 3.7 or higher installed on your computer system to take advantage of this support. If you have older version please contact Henter-Joyce for upgrade.

Setting Theophilos for use with screen reading software:

If you use Theophilos with any screen reading software there is one important setting in Theophilos that you should pay attention to. Theophilos utilizes two movement modes for the cursor in Bible windows. In normal mode which is also the default, the cursor is static in the upper left corner of the window. By using the UP/DOWN arrow keys the Bible text moves by verse at a time. In this mode your reader will not be able to read a complete verse but only the first line as it appears in window (the rest wraps itself on following lines). To be able to move the cursor by lines instead of by verses you will first have to select this option in Settings/Bible dialog window »Page 73. This will allow the cursor to be freely moved by lines so your reader will be able to read every line of each verse.

To change the movement mode go to Settings dialog, select the Bible tab »Page 73 and check the Move by lines »Page 76 option.

However, this policy is limited only to the free package available on our website and it is further limited by the License Agreement. According to it, the free package can only be distributed over Internet, BBS and other electronic media. If distributed on CDs Theophilos cannot be the featured program, but only a part of larger collection of other programs or as a bonus application. According to the License Agreement, any distribution must be free of charge, and it must be clear from the packaging or documentation that Theophilos is offered as such. Furthermore, no modifications are allowed and the program must be in original compressed form. Any distribution beyond these guidelines must be authorized by the Distribution Agreement or special License Agreement.

Distributing Theophilos Library CD

We have a special program for interested distributors and resellers who wish to distribute our products. If you are an organization that would like to participate in this program, we would love to talk to you. We offer special wholesale prices to our distributors and you don't even have to carry the stock. We can ship all orders directly to your customers. Since we understand how valuable your works are we did everything we could to protect your copyrighted work from possible misuse. This version of Theophilos uses encryption technique in the module files so that there is no way they could be used in other application successfully.

In addition, if you have licensed a Professional edition of Scribe for Theophilos »Page 13 to

create your own modules you have the option of protecting your data by limiting the export and printing of a particular document in Theophilos. You can totally disallow these features if you wish, however the clipboard function will still work in Windows.

You can distribute your data in a locked state so without a special unlock code the module is totally unusable for the user since it will not be opened by Theophilos and the information it contains cannot be accessed by any standard application.

However, you should always keep in mind that computer data can never be 100% safe and that the only true protection is your copyright notice.

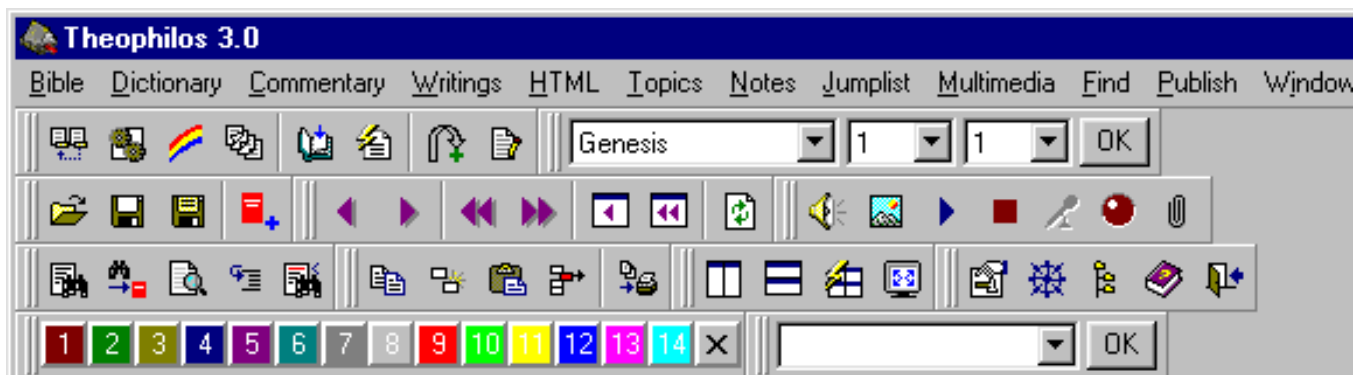

Reusable windows

One of the unique features of Theophilos are the reusable windows. When studying the Bible along with other texts very soon you will find your desktop cluttered with open windows which can greatly reduce the quality of the study. Frequent closing and reopening of the necessary documents can often cause losing your focus of your study. The solution is the reusable window which will greatly help to minimize this by reusing any already opened window for display of a new document without having to open a new window.

There are several approaches to taking advantage of this functionality. You can either drag and drop an icon from the Navigator »Page 70 on any window or mark any one or more windows as reusable. This will cause the program to use the current or last active reusable window to automatically accept the document's text for display. When you double click an icon in Navigator or select the document from the menu the text will display in a reusable window changing its content.

In addition, each window keeps track of all documents that were displayed in it in a special window history record.

To mark any window as reusable, right-click with your mouse while in the window's area and select Reusable from the pop-up menu or click on the appropriate icon in the History toolbar or press Alt+R keys when the desired window is currently the active window.

Some versions have different number of verses, or verse numbering does not correspond with others. In this case the first version in the list is held to be dominant. If you want a different version to be at the first position use Switch version »Page 39 command.

Just one of the fast and intuitive ways of navigating through the Bible in Theophilos. Gets you to the book of your choice instantly.

Set bookmark for [verse name]

Bookmarks come very handy if you want to mark several passages you often recall. You can set up to ten bookmarks which are being shared by every Bible version. When setting a bookmark first click on the verse you want to mark. This verse becomes the active verse throughout the program. Click on Set bookmark for [name of verse you picked]. Theophilos shows all current bookmarks with verse names they point to (Genesis 1:1 by default). Choose one you want to replace with your new bookmark.

Tip:

For more advanced way of bookmarking verses and for creating lists of verses use jumplists »Page 49 instead.

Gets you to the verse you bookmarked previously with Set bookmark »Page 40 command.

Bible menu Synchronized

With this command you may toggle your preference of having the content of active version window move in accord with all others which have this option also checked. Great feature when comparing several versions.

Note:

Some versions use different verse numbering as others. Theophilos tries to synchronize versions based on verse names (e.g. 3 John 1:14). If you find that the text content of compared verses differs use manual synchronization instead of automatic. This setting may be selected in Settings dialog under Bible tab »Page 73. While in Compare mode »Page 40 only automatic synchronization is used.

Tip:

You may have one primary version opened in one window and all others in a different window with Compare mode option checked. This way while browsing only one version you may compare it with all other versions without taking up much desktop space.

You can also drag and drop any version on any existing window from the Navigator. The window text will switch to new version at the place of the previous version.

Bible menu Coloring

With this command you may toggle your preference of having the text of active Bible version window appear colored. If this mode is turned on you can color any selected portion of text using the color palette on the toolbar.

To color the text, first turn the coloring on for the selected Bible window, select the desired portion of text with your mouse or keyboard and either click on the desired color or press an appropriate key combination »Page 30.

You may define your own colors in the palette by holding a Ctrl key while clicking on the color button you desire to change. All coloring in the Bible will change from old to new color instantly. For example if you change the value of red the words of Christ in the King James Bible will change their color accordingly.

You will find that your KJV Bible now features Jesus' words in red. Open your KJV Bible and turn the coloring on by clicking on the appropriate icon or right clicking the mouse on the Bible text and select coloring there. Then move to any of the Gospels and look for text in red. Is it there? Praise the Lord!

Tip:

You may share your Bible coloring with other users. If you create a richly colored Bible version in Theophilos you may offer your coloring scheme to others. All you need to send is the file with the abbreviated name of the Bible version and the COL extension. For example, if the abbreviated name of the Bible is "KJV" then look for the "kjb.col" file in Theophilos' program folder. This file contains all coloring for the KJV Bible. However, be aware that users may redefine the default color values so the colored text may appear in different colors than in your copy of Theophilos.

Bible menu**Bind notes**

With this option checked you link current version window and all commentary/note windows, so that their content movements are synchronized. To move notes automatically version window must be active and commentary/note windows must have Bind to Bible »Page 48 option checked.

Tip:

If you don't want certain commentary/note set to move automatically make sure the Bind to Bible »Page 48 option of that particular window is unchecked.

Bible menu**Opening a Bible version**

Any number of version windows may be opened at any time. Even same version in multiple windows. This allows for compares of Bibles, books, chapters, etc.

Number of versions listed here depends on number of versions loaded.

Note:

When new topic is saved it is given the name currently displayed in the topics drop-down box. When saving new topics make sure that correct name is displayed here. To prevent any inconsistencies of naming topics try to save the new topic with correct name as soon as possible. After topic is saved Theophilos will not allow changing its name.

Tip:

To change the name of the topic after it is saved use following procedure:
Select all text in the topic window (Ctrl+A). Copy the selected text to the clipboard with the Copy command. Now add new topic and give it a new name. Paste the text previously copied to the clipboard with the Paste command. Save changes with the Save command. Go to the topic with the original name and delete it with the Delete item or Delete topic command.

Context of [verse name]

Verse represented by a reference under cursor is displayed in the first available version window. If no Bible version window is currently opened a new window will be opened to display the verse. If you have more than one Bible window opened click on the window that you desire to display the context (making it the active window), return to window with the reference and use the command again.

This feature comes handy in many dictionaries, commentaries, outlines and reference materials where many verse references occur. Theophilos can recognize most of these references provided that a proper syntax is used. Before any library add-on is made available we provide a recognition file that allows Theophilos to recognize the reference style used. Authors of textual content can create recognition files that will enable Theophilos to recognize the verse references correctly.

Tip (does not apply to jumplists):

You may use references even in your notes and topic books. Only make sure you use the following syntax:

[BookAbbreviation]<space>[ChapterNumber]:[VerseNumber]

Optionally you may use comma to separate single verses, dash for range of verses, semicolon to separate single chapters. A reference then may look something like this:

Mt 17:14

or like this:

Mt 14:17, 19, 25; 22:15-20; 23; 2Th 3:5

Try this in your notes and topics!

For book names abbreviations you may use those that are appropriate for the language you use or you may create your own set.

Tip:

If the verse reference is not recognized properly make sure the cursor is over the chapter or verse part of the reference. Check the syntax, especially make sure no extra spaces or other punctuation is used. Make sure the reference is displayed on one line (try resizing the window). While this is usually not necessary there may be some cases when this helps. Use proper short book names. You may use the ones appropriate for the language you use. You can have them displayed in the Navigator's »Page 70 Bible tab if the Use short book names »Page 79 option is checked.

Note:

If used in search result window and jumplist this command will similarly show the verse under cursor in context.

Notes menu Bind to Bible

With this option checked content of note window is moved automatically whenever any

version window is browsed. Bind notes »Page 42 option of version window must be checked also. Combining these options on some windows you may very powerfully customize your desktop and thus enhance your browsing and study experience.

Moving mode

Another one of the helpful features to power-browse the Bible and resource works. Two modes are available: Smart mode and Normal mode.

Smart mode

If selected only existing notes are displayed. If the verse has no associated note, note window displays the closest previous existing note. This way you may see notes that cover whole passages of the Bible without losing the focus of proper note. You may try this feature with Matthew Henry's Commentary »Page 43 as an example.

Normal mode

Notes move with every verse even if note does not exist. In that case "No text" is displayed.

You may create jumplists automatically also by exporting the results of a Bible search into a jumplist. See Copier »Page 63 topic for more details.

Jumplist menu

Sort by

Jumplist may be sorted chronologically (in the order as verses appear in the Bible), in alphabetical order of verse descriptions or it can be displayed as unsorted list. Alphabetical order is especially useful if you provide your own descriptions instead of automatically generated ones. Unsorted option comes handy if you wish to have your jumplist ordered according to certain topics or in any custom order. The sorting mode is saved with each jumplist so when you open a jumplist it is sorted the way it was saved.

Tip:

You may quickly change the order by clicking on the column headers of the jumplist.

When in unsorted mode, you can move the jumps up or down in the list by holding the ALT key and pressing UP and DOWN arrows.

Jumplist menu

Add [verse name]

This command adds active verse to the list instantly. To change the active verse simply click on the desired verse in any Bible window.

Tip:

Theophilos will automatically generate description for every new verse in the jumplist by extracting specified number of first letters from the verse. It uses active Bible version text for description. See Settings/Other documents section »Page 73 on how to change the number of letters for the auto-descriptions. You may edit the descriptions with the Edit command »Page 51.

This command will allow you to edit the descriptions generated automatically by the program.

Multimedia menu

Open...

Opens multimedia files. Depending on filter in the open dialog used only picture or sound files are shown. Only pictures in the Windows Bitmap (*.bmp) or JPEG compressed (*.jpg) format are currently supported. In case of sound Wave files (*.wav) and MPEG layer 3 (*.mp3) files are currently recognized and motion video (*.avi and *.mpg) are supported only through an installed external motion video player.

Note:

You must have sound system installed and properly configured in order to play sound files. To play compressed Wave files you must have sound compression support installed in addition.

Multimedia menu

Verse sound

Plays sound currently attached to the active verse. If this option stays checked corresponding sound is played every time a verse with sound attached becomes the top verse in the active Bible window.

Note:

You may record your own sounds for every verse in the Bible. See Record command »Page 52 for more details.

Multimedia menu **Verse picture**

Opens special picture window used to display pictures attached to verses. If this option stays checked corresponding picture is shown every time a verse with picture attached becomes the top verse in the active Bible window.

Multimedia menu **Autoplay**

This feature will let you play sounds and show pictures in multimedia presentation of God's Word.

Note:

You may create your own narration »Page 52 and attach own pictures »Page 52 and thus customize presentations for different types of audiences from children to adult.

Multimedia menu **Stop**

This command stops the Autoplay feature »Page 52 and ceases playback of any sound.

Multimedia menu **Record**

Custom sounds, e.g. your own audio verse notes or narration of the Bible may be recorded without leaving Theophilos' program interface. While recording a red LED light is flashing on the Multimedia toolbar.

Note:

Recording is possible only if sound system is properly installed and configured. You must have a working microphone attached in addition to be able to record your voice.

Tip:

Try to make your recordings as efficient as possible as sound files take much space on your harddisk. You may customize the quality and efficiency of sound files in the Settings/Multimedia »Page 73 section.

Multimedia menu **Attach media to [verse name]**

You may attach existing sound or picture file (depending on dialog file filter used) to every

verse in the Bible. This is useful to produce multimedia presentations of God's Word which will surely attract the attention of your audience.

Note:

Sound and picture files are copied to new location according to verse name. Therefore be careful when attaching many copies of large files as this may take up much disk space.

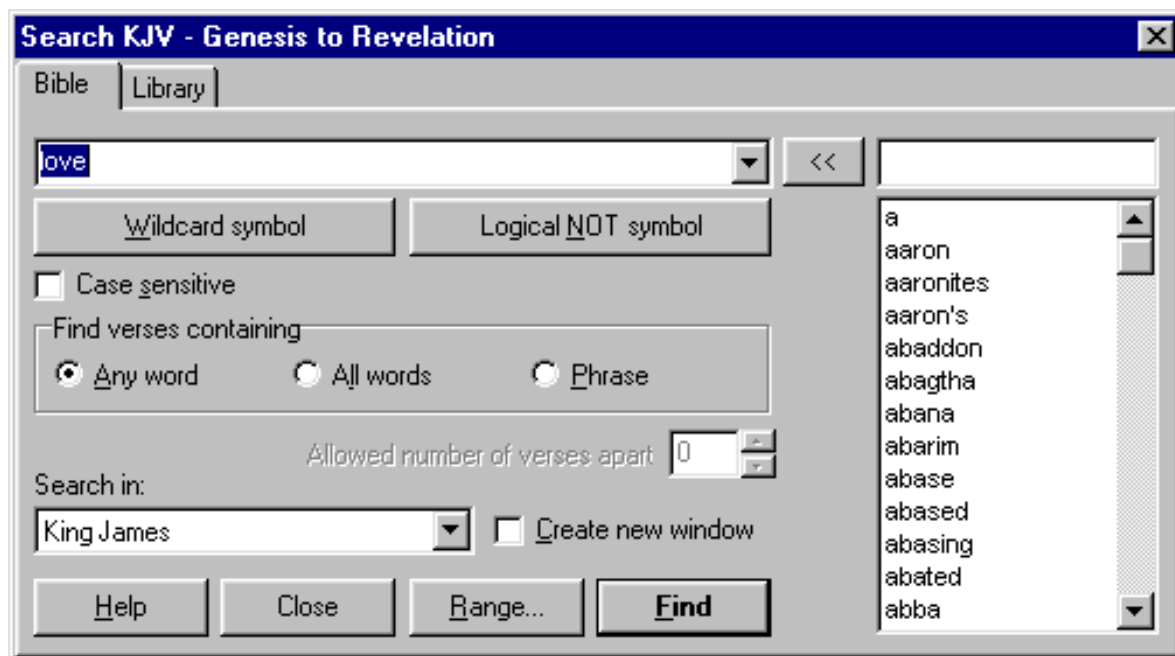

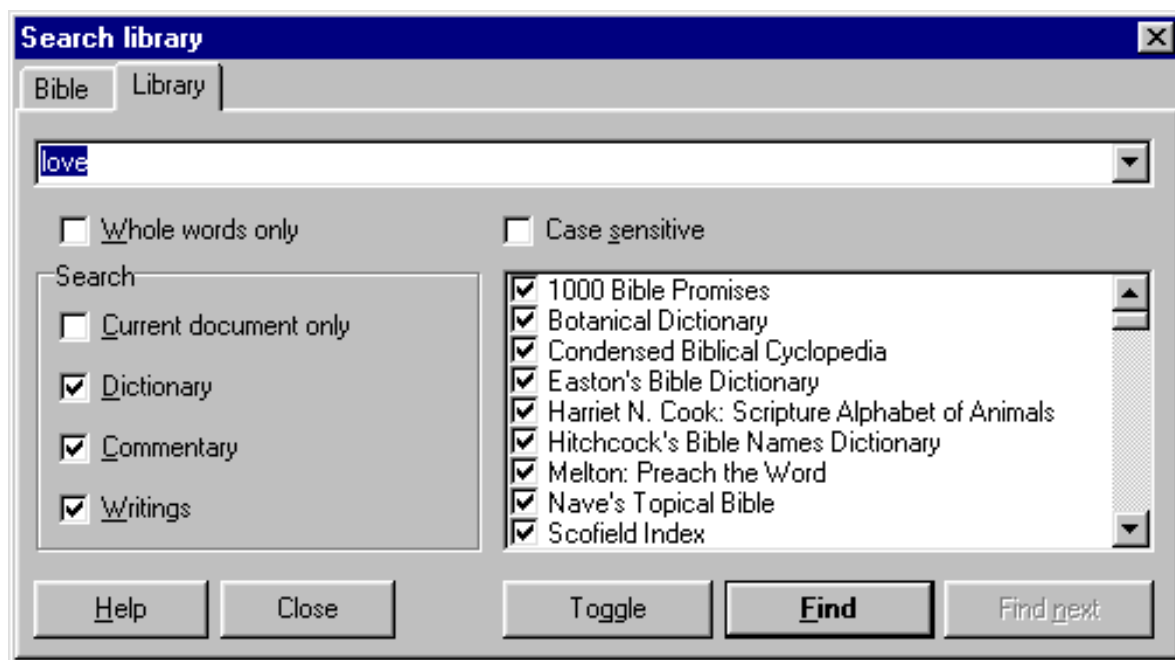

Finder dialog

Search text input box (Bible mode)

Here you enter text you want to search for. You may use an asterisk or wildcard character (*) at the beginning or end of any incomplete word. Use a tilde character (~) to separate words not to be included in the search. For ease of input of these characters use the Wildcard symbol »Page 55 and Logical NOT symbol »Page 55 buttons.

Example:

**dish* ~ *honour*

this will search for verses containing words *reddish, dish, dishes, Dishan* but not *dishonour*

Note:

If more than one logical NOT operators are encountered only first one is taken into respect.

Any punctuation except asterisk (*), logical NOT operator (~) and apostrophe (') will be ignored. All searches are case insensitive until the case sensitive option is turned on.

Theophilos discerns between words with and without an apostrophe (e.g. *Aaron's* is a unique word and therefore is treated as such in searches).

When the case sensitive option is set you must use exact letter case to get the desired results.

Finder dialog Wildcard symbol

Wildcard symbol - asterisk (*) is used when searching for incomplete words. This symbol can be placed at the beginning and/or end of the word.

Example:

*dis**

This will search for all words starting with "*dis*" e.g. dish, Dishan, dishonour

**ron*

This will search for all words ending with "*ron*" e.g. Aaron, Hebron, iron

ron

This will search for all words with "*ron*" anywhere in the word e.g. iron, strong, wrong

Finder dialog Logical NOT symbol

Logical or boolean operator NOT is used in searches to filter out words not to be included in a search. Typical use is in conjunction with a wildcard character (*) where use of the asterisk would produce unwanted words to be searched for.

Example:

dis ~ dishonour*

This will search for all words starting with "*dis*" except the word "*dishonour*"

Note:

This option will not exclude entire verses if other conditions of the search are met for a particular verse.

Finder dialog **Case sensitive**

Makes your searches case sensitive. You must use exact letter case to get the desired results.

Finder dialog **Search mode**

Depending on your requirements you may choose from three search modes.

Find verses containing:

Any word

Result will include verses containing any one, all or any combination of words in any order specified in Search text input box »Page 54.

All words

Result will include only verses where all specified words appear. Order of words may vary. Only in this mode proximity search »Page 56 option is available.

Phrase

Only verses containing specified words in specified order will be found.

Note:

You may use the wildcard symbol »Page 55 (*) and logical NOT symbol »Page 55 (~) in any of these search modes.

Tip:

Try complex searching capabilities of Theophilos by searching the search results over with different search specifications.

Try this example using King James Version:

1. Do a search for words "david" and "king" in "All words" mode.
2. Use "Search these results »Page 62" command and search again for "king over israel" with "Phrase" mode set.

In the first step 154 verses will be found. In the next step only 8 verses on the subject of David being a king over Israel will be filtered out.

Finder dialog **Allowed number of verses apart**

This powerful option will allow for proximity searching by specifying number of verses searched words can be apart from each other. This advanced searching method is necessary

when searching for certain group of words that should appear close to each other in the Bible yet not necessarily within the same verse.

Note:

This option is available only in "All words" search mode.

Example:

Try searching for "Peter" and "keys" and specify 1 verse proximity. Theophilos will find two verses - one with the word "Peter" and other with "keys" neighboring with each other.

Finder dialog

Search in

Switches the Bible version to be searched. Words list »Page 58 - if showing - is updated. Theophilos can switch to appropriate version automatically every time the Finder »Page 53 is invoked if the Smart version switching »Page 79 option is checked.

Tip:

Right-clicking anywhere in the Finder will show a pop-up menu to let you quickly switch to different version »Page 57. Alternatively you may use a Alt+[version number] key combination.

Finder dialog

Create new window

When checked Theophilos creates new results window every time a search is performed. Thus you may have several search results windows opened at any time.

Tip:

You may use this option to do many different searches based on results of one or more previous search results. There is no limit on how deep and complex your searches may become.

Finder dialog

<< button

Copies word from Words list edit box »Page 57 and appends it to the Search text input box »Page 54. Double clicking on the Words list »Page 58 or Alt+Insert key combination may be used instead.

Finder dialog

Words list edit box

Here you can input any word to quickly find out if the word is contained in particular version. If so the word will be highlighted in the Words list »Page 58. As you type Theophilos will try to find the closest matching word.

Tip:

Clicking on the list will put the highlighted word into the Words list edit box.
Double click will append the word to Search text input box »Page 54.

Finder dialog Words list

A complete list of all words contained in selected version of the Bible.

Tip:

Clicking on the list will insert the highlighted word into the Words list edit box »Page 57.
Double click will append the word to Search text input box »Page 54.

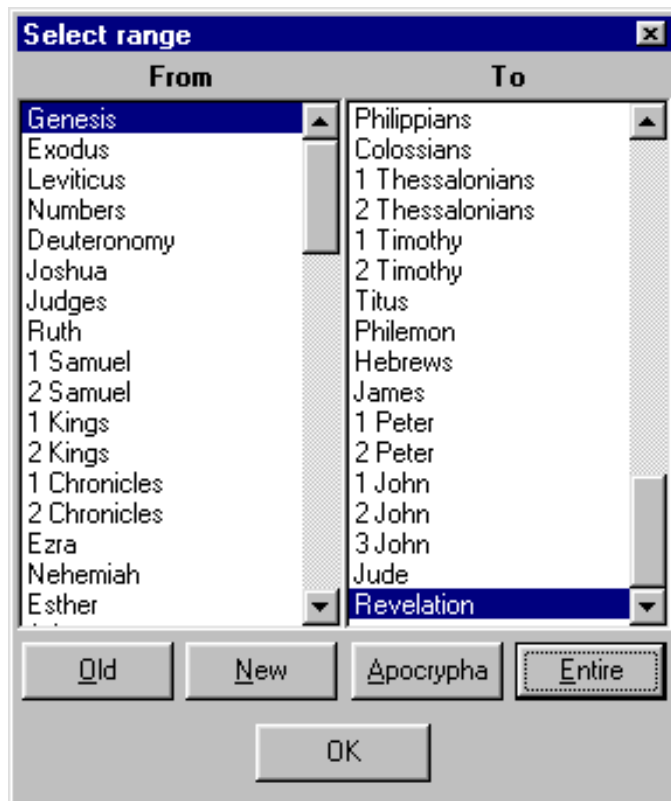
Finder dialog Help

Opens this online help file.

Finder dialog Close

Closes the Finder dialog without performing any search.

Finder dialog Range



Use this dialog to confine the search to specified range of books. Use the buttons as shortcuts for selecting pre-defined ranges as indicated by their captions.

Tip:

Double clicking will select the same book in the opposite listbox.

Finder dialog

Find

This command executes the search. If the Search text input box is empty or no verse matching the search criteria is found the message box will appear. Input some text to search for or close the dialog by Close »Page 58 button.

Finder dialog

Find next

Finds next occurrence of the searched character string in the document beginning from the current position.

Finder dialog Toggle

Toggles all selected documents. Check marked items become unchecked and vice versa.

Finder dialog Font settings

Generally there is no need to change the default font for Finder dialog. For some foreign Bible versions there may be necessary to use a different font character set. Theophilos does this automatically, if you have installed an appropriate language support in Windows operating system. For Greek versions you must have Theophilos Greek Normal font installed. This font may be found in Theophilos' program folder or on Theophilos Library CD »Page 96. You must install it yourself using common MS Windows™ routine for installing fonts.

Finder dialog Search text input box (Library mode)

Here you enter text you want to search for.

Finder dialog Whole words only

Turn this option on if you wish to search for whole words (as typed in the search text box). Otherwise substring search will be performed searching for words that contain the search string.

Finder dialog Searching documents

You may search any document in your library in Theophilos. You decide if you want to search only the currently active document or several documents in one search.

Find menu Find in dictionary topics

This advanced feature allows you to search topics of all open dictionaries (at least one needs to be opened) for the selected text. If found dictionary will jump to the found topic, else it will display a "No matches for [selection]" message in its status bar. Any opened user topic books will be searched as well.

Note:

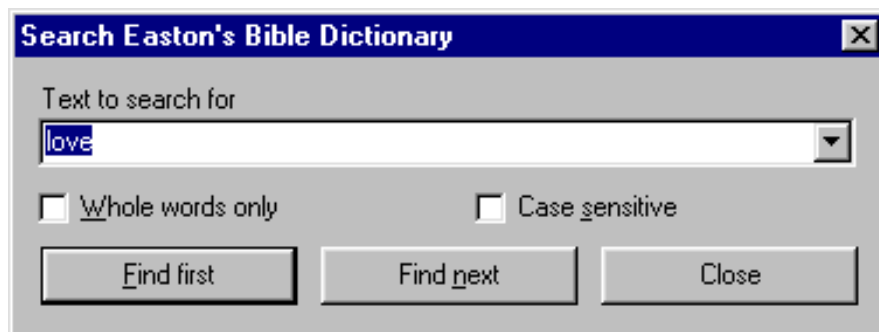
This command works in all types of windows. You have to select text prior to using this command. Theophilos will try to match the selected text exactly or, if it doesn't succeed, as close as seems reasonable.

To search the text content of dictionary instead of its topics use Search this document command »Page 61.

Tip:

Try to keep selections as short as possible for better results. A more powerful feature is the dictionary/commentary pop-up window. If you double-click with your mouse on any word in any document a special window will open to let you select any of the installed dictionaries. If you double-click on the verse reference in Bible windows the window will offer commentaries instead.

Any document in Theophilos may be searched through this dialog (for Bible windows use Finder dialog instead). Theophilos will find text also in user files including notes, topic books and jumplists.

To search specific document make its window active (click on it) then activate the search dialog again.

You may also search the entire library of all installed documents in one step using the Finder dialog.

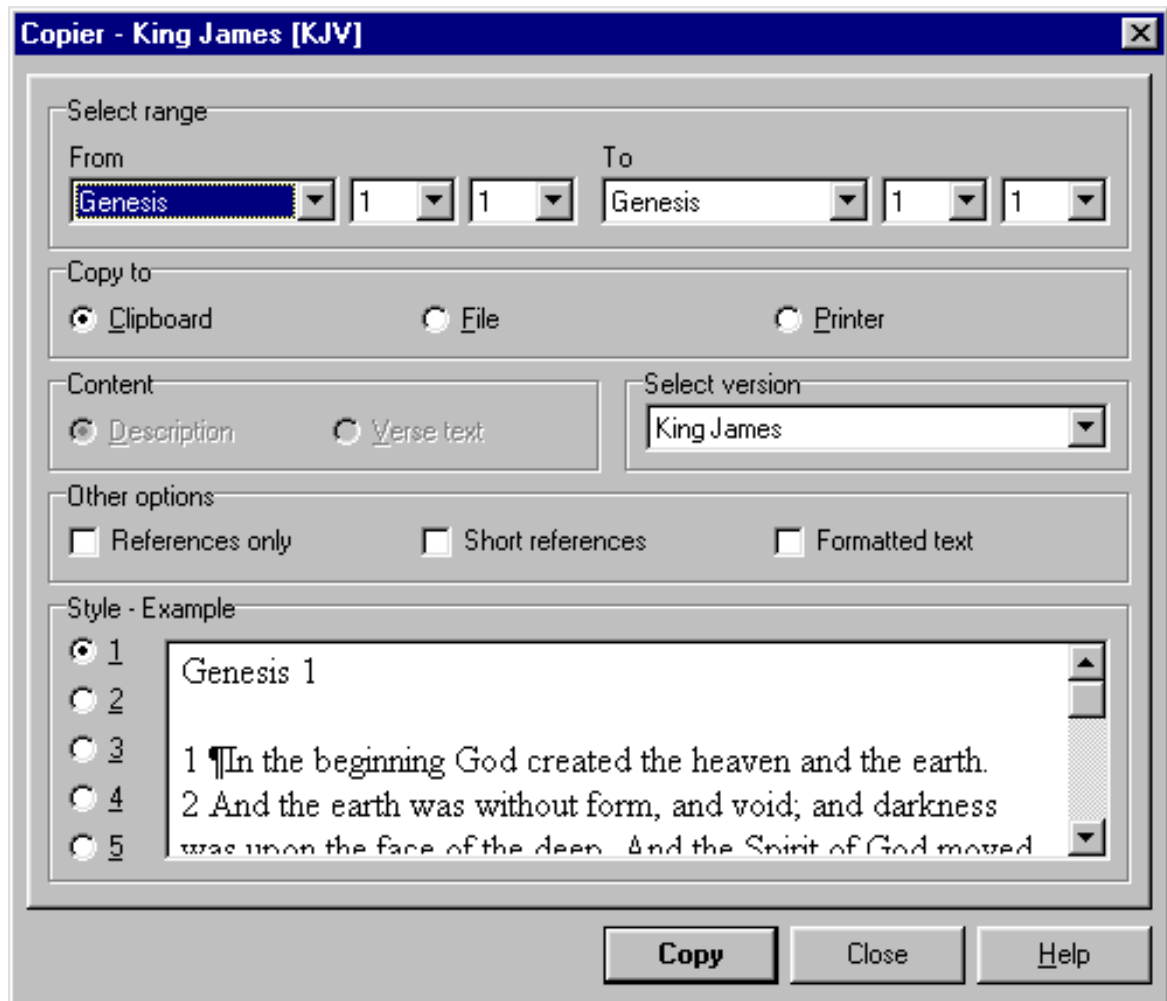

Copier



Copier is an advanced tool for most outputs from Theophilos software. It allows you to copy, save or print any and all texts from Bible versions, notes, commentaries, dictionaries or even jumplists and search results. If you have time and enough paper in your printer you can even print the whole Bible. While this is probably an extreme and unreasonable use of the Copier tool we only want to illustrate its possibilities.

Note:

The export and printing of some documents may be limited due to copyrights. In some special cases the export and printing may not be allowed at all. This is not a limitation of Theophilos, but an option for the publishers and copyright holders of certain works.

Most common uses of the Copier are printing of user notes for archiving or other purposes, copying of larger amounts of text or verses and pasting them into your favorite word processor. Copier allows even exports of search results into jumplists for later reference or various study purposes.

Copier can use any window as the source for the output (except HTML documents). To select the source simply click on the desired window so that this window becomes the active window. Now activate the Copier (click on the speed button or menu command). Copier will inform you about the source it will use in its caption bar. Copier works in two modes (switching between them is done automatically without the user intervention) depending on the source window.

If the source is a **Bible version, commentary, user note set, jumplist** or **search results** window you may select the range of verses for output. As a built-in feature Copier will automatically select the relevant range of verses (in case of Bible version this is the currently active verse, in case of commentary or note set the first and last existing note, in case of jumplist first and last verse jump and in case of search results the first and last of found verses). This range of course may be adjusted to allow you to select only portion you wish to use for the output.

Next you select the output target which may be the Windows clipboard, file or any printer accessible from your computer. If the source window is search results window you have a choice to export to jumplist in addition.

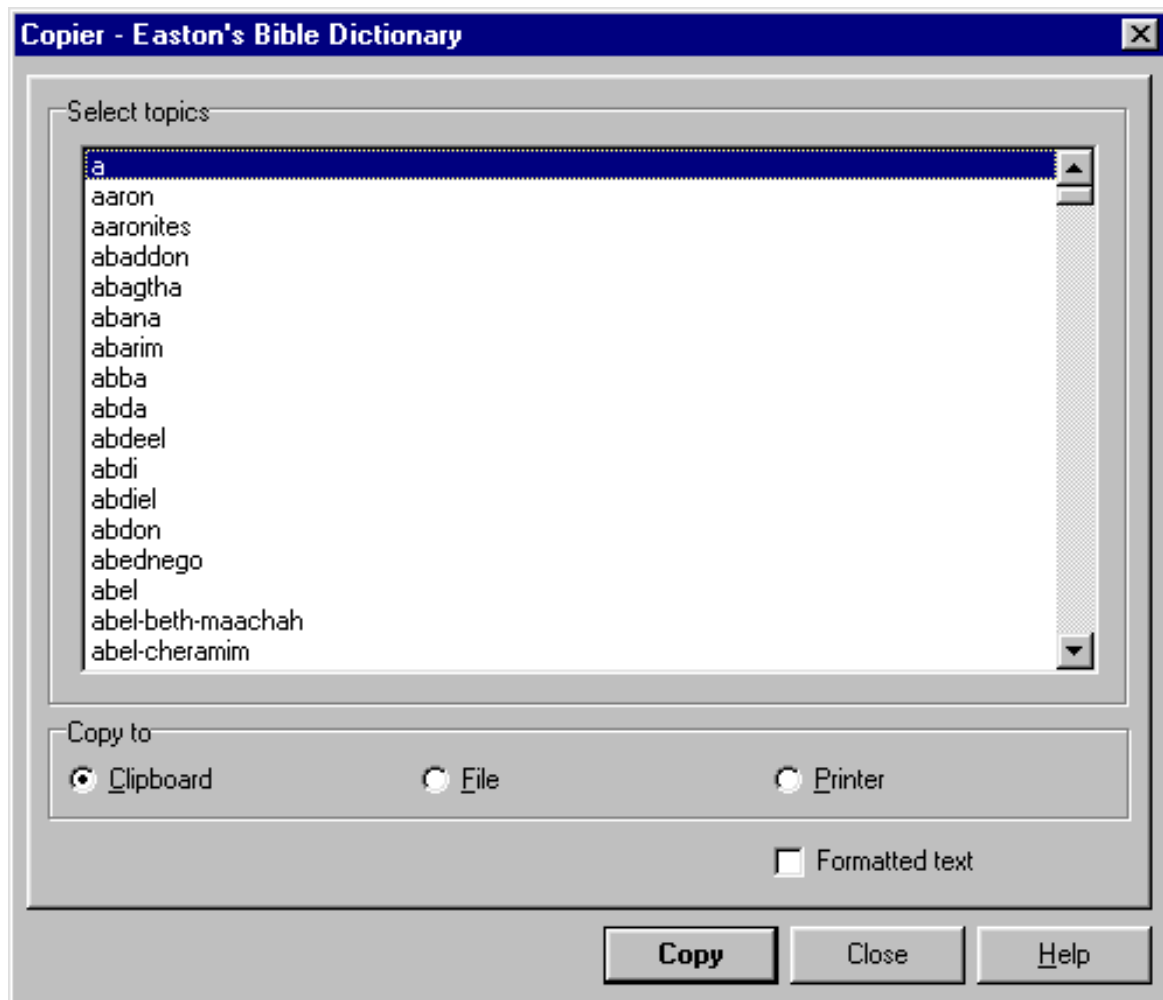
If source window is a jumplist you are allowed to choose the content of the output to be the reference description or actual text of the referenced verse.

If available choose the Bible version used for the output. This choice is available only for Bible version, search results and jumplist windows.

There are 5 predefined output styles you can choose from. Try switching between them to see the final outlook and select one that will suit your needs.

After you execute the output it may be interrupted any time by pressing the Escape key on your keyboard.

Other options allow you to choose only verse references as the output, use long or short Bible references and whether the text should be sent as plain text or formatted.



The Copier starts in dictionary mode if the active window is a **dictionary, writing** or **user topic book**. Here you may select one or more topics for output. To select more than one hold Ctrl key while selecting single topics or Shift key when selecting range of topics.

The use of output target selector is the same in both modes. You also have the option to send the text as plain text or formatted.

Note:

When printing, Copier will use the font settings of source window (as displayed in example box). If you wish to print in different font change these font settings. As an exception default font settings of Bible windows are used for jumplists.

Publish menu

Copy

Applies to all windows.

This command copies selected text to clipboard. When copying larger amount of text use

Copier »Page 63 tool instead.

Note:

In jumplist this command copies entire verse reference with description. This can be then pasted into different jumplist.

Tip:

This command will copy text without the formatting. To copy the text with all formatting use the Ctrl+Ins key combination »Page 30.

Publish menu

Copy verse

Applies to version, results windows and jumplists.

Copies single verse under cursor to clipboard. It is not necessary to select all of the text. The verse under cursor is copied in its entirety and verse reference is placed at the end. This is very helpful when quoting from the Bible. Verse can be pasted into any text editor (or user notes and user topic book). When copying of more then one verse is necessary use Copier »Page 63 tool instead.

Note:

If copying from jumplist text from active Bible version is used. To change active version switch to this version before copying.

Publish menu

Copy reference

Applies to version, results windows and jumplists.

Copies single reference of verse under cursor to clipboard. It is not necessary to select any text. This is helpful when referring to Bible verse in your topic books or notes. The reference can be pasted into any text editor (or user notes and user topic book). When copying more then one reference would be desirable (i.e. the results of a Bible search) use Copier »Page 63 tool instead.

Paste

Applies to user notes, user topic books and jumplists.

This command is used to paste text copied to clipboard from any Theophilos window or other Windows application.

Note:

In jumplist only verse jump from other jumplist can be pasted.

Delete item

Applies to user topic books, search results and jumplists.

Depending on active window different action is performed.

In **user topic book** currently shown topic is deleted.

This command displays the content of the document history record for the selected document.

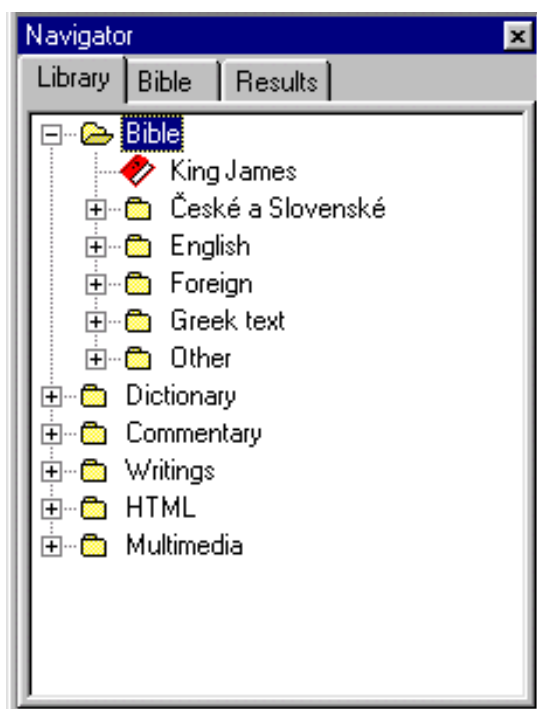

Program menu Navigator



Library

One of the great features of Theophilos is the organization and accessibility of library items. With hundreds of modules already available for Theophilos you can have them all nicely organized in a library tree always ready to be used. This is one purpose of the Navigator tool.

You can open any document by double clicking its icon in the Navigator or by dragging its icon to any open window. If you have at least one window marked as reusable, the document will open in that window replacing its content. If you wish to open the document in a new window you can press and hold the Ctrl key while double clicking the document icon. The

same works if you open the document from the menu.

Bible

Other purpose of the Navigator is navigating the Bible text. Getting to any place in the Bible is a breeze. But if you'd rather prefer to enter the verse reference by typing it directly you may do so with the verse reference input box. This is hidden by default so you will have to change the setting in the Program/Toolbars menu.

Results

Finally, the Navigator will display also the results of a library search from the Finder tool. By double clicking the document icon the document will open with the first occurrence of the search string highlighted. You can then proceed to search further by pressing F3 until no more matches are found.

Tip for using the Bible tab:

Double clicking on any list box or hitting the "Enter" key on your keyboard is equivalent to clicking on the OK button.

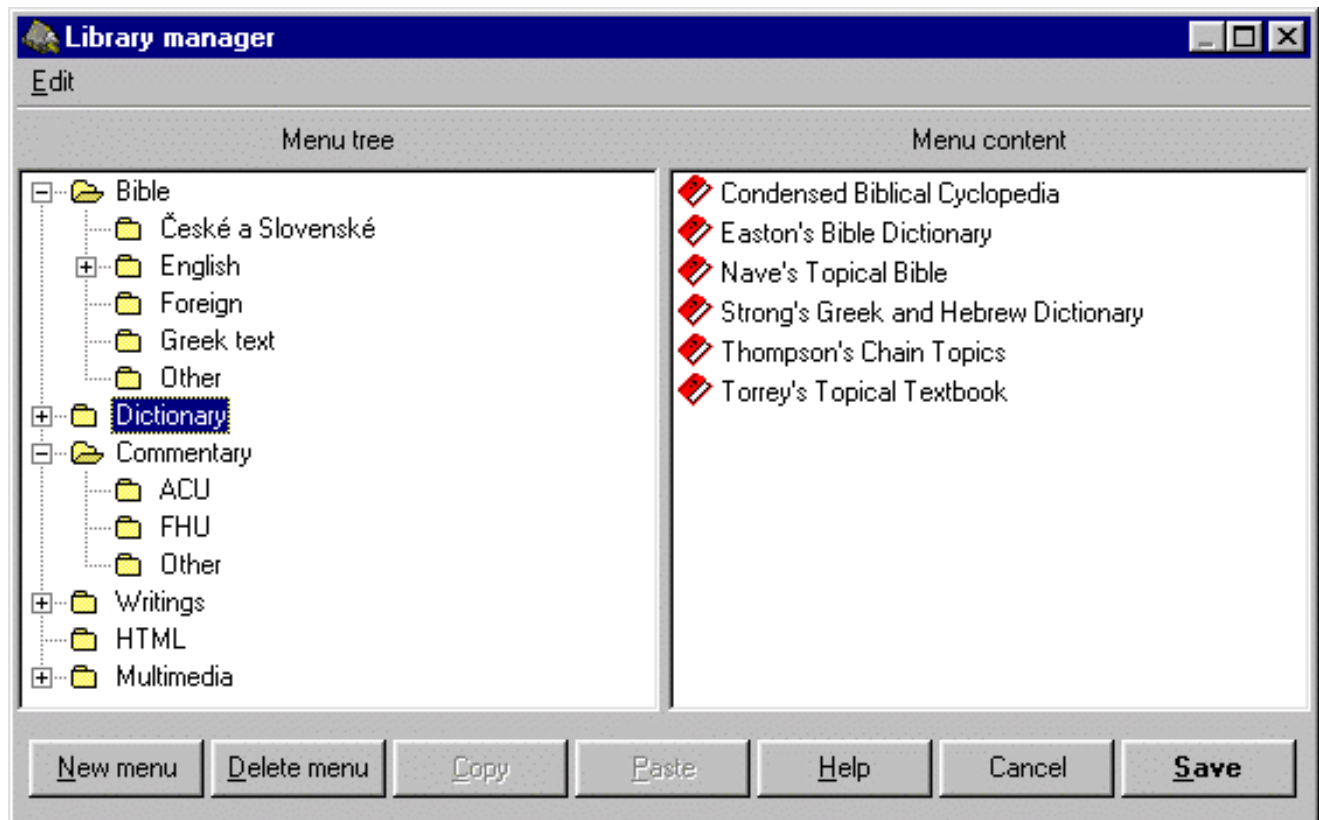
We have created a smaller version of Navigator's Bible tab we call "Mini Navigator". It can stay visible on the program's toolbar at all times for your convenience. Pressing Tab key while in the Bible window will shift the focus on Mini Navigator's controls. You may select the reference using the arrow keys and move from one edit box to the other with Tab key. When you are finished, just press Enter key to go to the reference of your choice.

Note:

Display of long or short Book names in the Navigator can be toggled in Settings/Miscellaneous section »Page 73. The display font may also be customized to suit your preference. Check the Settings/Fonts section »Page 73 topic for details.

Program menu

Library manager



Library manager will let you organize your library to your liking. With hundreds of modules for Theophilos available on Internet and several CD titles sold worldwide you will find this tool indispensable. The library structure that you create will be used in the Navigator's Library tree and also in the menus.

The left panel shows the tree structure of your library, while the right panel shows the items contained by the currently selected folder on the left.

The following example will show how you can easily organize your Bible versions (more Bible versions are accessible from the Theophilos Library CD). The same technique will work for all other types of documents:

1. Open the Library manager
2. Click on the Bible folder icon on the left panel (Menu tree).
3. Click on the New menu button.
4. Type in "Foreign versions" as the new menu item's title and press Enter when done.
5. Click on the Bible folder icon again to show the Bible versions.
6. Drag and drop the Bible versions from the right panel (Menu content) onto the newly created "Foreign versions" folder icon on the left (instead of drag and drop technique you can use the clipboard to move the icons. Click on Copy button to copy the selected version icons, select the desired folder icon on the left and click on the Paste button).

Program menu Toolbars

This menu allows you turn on/off any toolbar. You may also choose to temporarily turn all toolbars off to save extra space on your monitor.

When checked and a new window is opened or closed all windows will be automatically rearranged to fit in the main Theophilos window.

Save window setup now

You may prefer to have certain windows opened every time Theophilos starts or save several setups for different purposes. This may include Bible versions, notes, etc. This command will save the information about currently opened windows and main window, complete with their settings and positions on the screen. When the program starts it will use the last used desktop setup file to restore the application desktop.

The desktop setup dialog will let you create new desktop setup file. You may title your desktop to best describe its purpose. You may create new desktop setup by entering its title and adding it to the list.

Tip:

If you wish to have these settings permanent make sure the Save window setup on exit »Page 74 options remains unchecked or they will be overwritten upon exiting the program.

If you no longer wish to have any windows opened upon startup simply create a new setup or choose an existing one and save it while no windows are opened.

Smart synchronization

Bible version windows can have their content synchronized which allows comparing several versions next to each other. When smart synchronization is used Theophilos will attempt to synchronize version text based upon verse names. Some versions use different verse numbering and the differences can be so large that Theophilos will no longer be able to synchronize texts correctly. If this is the case turn this option off and you will be able to synchronize individual windows manually based upon their content.

To perform manual synchronization use following procedure:

Turn Smart synchronization off. Activate first of the windows you wish to synchronize manually and turn its synchronized mode on. Activate next Bible window turn its synchronized mode off, position its content so it matches the content of the first window and turn its synchronized mode on. From this point these windows will keep their position as set. You can repeat this procedure on as many Bible windows as you wish.

Tip:

Try manual synchronization when comparing synoptical gospels within the same version by opening the same version in multiple views and using the above procedure.

Note:

If Bible window is in Compare mode, Smart synchronization is used regardless of this setting.

Settings – Bible section **Open in synchronized mode**

When this option is checked Bible windows are opened in Synchronized mode.

Settings – Bible section **Move by lines**

This option will allow the cursor to be moved line by line instead of verse by verse which is necessary for the screen reader software used by visually impaired users to read every line as the cursor is moved.

Settings – Bible section **Versions to load on startup**

When loading time and conserving memory is of concern you may choose to load only Bible versions you plan to use. While this is not recommended since it narrows your study possibilities you may find this feature necessary in some cases.

Note:

At least one version must stay selected (Theophilos will not allow deselecting of all versions). After you made your selection you must restart Theophilos for changes to take effect. Selected versions will be loaded next time the program starts.

Note:

Theophilos will start even if no Bible versions are found on startup. In this case the program will switch to general literature reader mode »Page 82 automatically. In this mode all Bible study related functions are disabled and hidden. You need to specify a correct path for Bible data modules or have the CD-ROM (if available) in your CD-ROM drive at all times when running the program to have the program switch back to Bible study mode.

Settings – Bible section **Choose on startup**

When checked a window will appear upon the start of the program to let you choose and confirm the loading of selected Bible versions. Helpful when conserving memory or loading time and changing the selection of loaded versions frequently.

You may choose only certain Bible versions to appear in a window with compare mode set. This may be necessary if many versions are loaded and some are not visible due to lack of available space.

Tip:

You do not have to guess this setting since the widths are adjusted and changes are visible immediately when using keyboard arrows or small arrow buttons next to this edit box.

Number of characters in auto-descriptions

Theophilos will use this setting when creating auto-descriptions for new verse jumps added to jumplists. Number of actual characters may vary since Theophilos will not split words and will always add only complete words. The rest of incomplete verse is replaced with three periods (...). These are not added if the verse is complete.

Settings – Other documents

Use search version for context

When checked and Context of [verse name] »Page 48 command is issued program looks for opened window with corresponding Bible version. If it doesn't find one it will create it. If this option is turned off the first available Bible window is used to show the context regardless of Bible version. To have the context shown in any particular Bible window click on this window and return back to Search results window.

Settings – Other documents

Highlight color

In search results the words you were doing a search on are shown in different color. You may change this color to suit your preference.

Settings – Fonts

Default font settings

Change these settings if you wish that all new windows use common font to display their content. Virtually all types of windows can have custom font set. If you use other than western character set especially in your user files you should change it here.

Note:

Individual font settings can be set in every window through the pop-up menu but will be lost again when you close the window. Use default setting to make them permanent.

Special case are Bible windows where default font settings are always used for verse reference (book, chapter and verse number) regardless of window's individual setting.

Settings – Multimedia section

Use media from CD

This option is available only if there is Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 (or other CD with Theophilos) in your CD-ROM drive and Data files path »Page 80 points to it. If this option is checked all verse sounds and pictures are played from CD (if available). If you wish to listen to your own audio notes or narration turn this option off.

Settings – Multimedia section

Play sound on startup

If you do not wish to listen to the opening music turn this option off.

Settings – Multimedia section

Recording quality

Your recordings can have different sound quality. **Keep in mind that better quality consumes more space on your harddisk.** Try these settings and use the one that suits you best.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Finder opens in active version

If this option is checked Finder »Page 53 will always switch automatically to active Bible version when opening.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Smart saving

When checked all changes in user files will be saved automatically without the user intervention. No confirmation dialog will display. Otherwise Theophilos will always ask the user to save or cancel the changes made.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Create backups

Backup file with original content is created every time a file is saved when this option is checked.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Remember dictionary pop-up position

When set the dictionary/commentary pop-up window will open at the position where it was last shown and will not follow the mouse cursor.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Use short book names in Navigator

In Navigator »Page 70 you may choose to display full names of the books or their common abbreviations. While full names are easier to navigate through, especially for those who are not yet familiar with the names of the Bible books, using abbreviations may save you some desktop space (depending on your Theophilos windows setup).

Tip:

You can customize the book names and book abbreviations by editing them in the language plug-in file. For more information click here »Page 87.

Settings – Miscellaneous section Use short verse names when copying

When checked Bible books abbreviations are used in verse references when copying verses to clipboard or using the Copier tool.

Settings – Miscellaneous section

Copy italics in parenthesis

If checked all Bible text in italics will be enclosed in parenthesis upon copying verse to clipboard or using the Copier tool. Otherwise normal text (no italics) will be copied.

Settings – Paths section

Data files path

This path should point to folder containing the data files (Bible versions, dictionaries, etc.). Normally this is used to point to CD-ROM drive where Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 or other CD with Theophilos files can be found. However in special cases (in network configurations »Page 20 for instance) you may use this setting to point to other folder. If no Bible version is found in this and additional search paths upon the program startup Theophilos will switch to general literature reader mode »Page 82.

Regardless of this setting Theophilos will always look first in folder it started from. This will allow for updates of data files should a newer version become available while preserving the value of the CD.

Settings – Paths section

Additional search paths

You can add several paths here which will be searched when the program starts for modules to be added to Theophilos' library.

Settings – Paths section

User files path

This setting should point to folder where you wish to keep your notes, topic books and jumplists. New files you create will be created in this folder. By default startup folder is used but this must be changed if you run Theophilos from CD as files cannot be created on CDs.

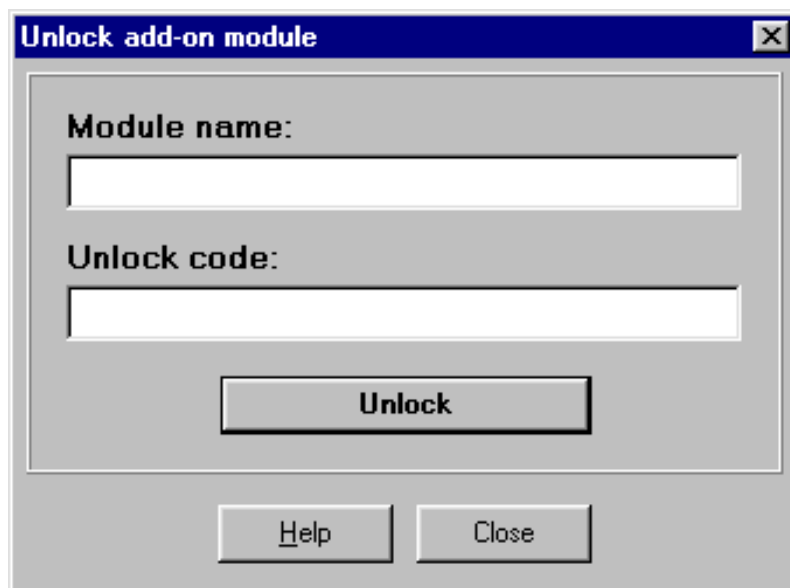

Some modules on Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 may be used only after a necessary

license fee is paid (due to licensing policies of copyright holders). Until then they remain locked on the CD. After the fee is paid the user will receive the unlock code to be able to use such add-on module. For more information about availability of special add-ons please see the "theocd.txt" file on the CD or visit our Internet site »Page 98.

If you have already received your code please follow these three steps:

1. Type in the module name **EXACTLY** as it appears in the documentation you have received. This means that you should use capital letters and any special characters where appropriate.
2. Type in the unlock code.
3. When you are finished with steps 1 and 2 press the Unlock button.

If you receive an error message "Incorrect unlock code" you must repeat the procedure again from step 1. Be certain you enter the module name and unlock code exactly as shown in the documentation you have received with your CD.

After you succeed (the program will inform you about this) you can enter the unlock information for other add-ons if you desire. When you are finished you must restart the program and new add-ons will be accessible from their appropriate menus.

Exit

Closes Theophilos application.

Font settings

This command will display font dialog to allow changes of font settings for current window.

Opening documents

Open dialog will let you choose the type of document to open with the filter edit box. All types of documents that Theophilos recognizes may be open including HTML documents, pictures, sounds and motion video files.

General literature reader mode

The primary use of the program is of course study of the Bible and other Christian writings. But Theophilos now serves two purposes: as a full featured Bible program and as general literature reader. The correct mode is chosen automatically by the program according to data modules found. If the program does not find any Bible texts, it will automatically choose the reader mode, since Bible functions would not serve any purpose.

You may find this useful in some cases to be able to use the program also at work for reading other literature and documents that do not have to be only religious in nature. These may include anything from poetry and fiction to technical manuals or other company documents. If your particular circumstances require that the program should act only as a general book reader then it will.

Bible mode

This mode will be used when at least one Bible version is found on start-up. Theophilos will act as a full featured Bible study application, allowing you to study the Bible text and do all the things you should expect from the Bible program.

Reader mode

In this mode all Bible study specific functions are disabled and relevant menu commands and other features are totally hidden. You will not find features like Bible menu, Commentary menu, Jumplists, some multimedia functions, Bible searching, some toolbars and others. This mode serves the needs of all users who wish to use Theophilos only as a general literature reader. Please note that this mode is only optional. The primary purpose of Theophilos is to help in your Bible study. You may find that in reader mode the program does not offer enough functionality, so use it only for special occasions.

If file of that name exists, Theophilos will ask you whether you want to overwrite that file.

Opening topic book

Under the Topics menu »Page 32 use the Open »Page 45 command to display the file open dialog. Choose topic book you wish to open.

Adding new topics to topic book

Under the Topics menu »Page 32 use the Add topic »Page 45 command. This will add new topic. Enter the name of the topic as it should be displayed in the list of topics. Enter the text of topic in the topic content box. Save your new topic with Save »Page 45 command. See Add topic »Page 45 for more details.

Renaming topics

Topic names cannot be changed directly after they were saved. To change the name of the topic after it was saved use following procedure:
Select all text in the topic window (Ctrl+A). Copy the selected text to the clipboard with the Copy command. Now add new topic and give it a new name. Paste the text previously copied to the clipboard with the Paste command. Save changes with the Save command. Go to the topic with the original name and delete it with the Delete item or Delete topic command.

Deleting topics

You can delete currently displayed topic with the Delete item »Page 67 or Delete topic »Page 32 (pop-up menu) command.

Creating new note set

Simply click on New set »Page 46 command in the Notes menu »Page 32. Dialog window will appear to let you fill in the name of your new note set. Since this name is used also as the file name (extension “.nts” is automatically added) it must be unique, e.g. only one user note set can have that name. If file of that name exists, Theophilos will ask you whether you want to overwrite that file.

Opening user note set

Under the Notes menu »Page 32 use the Open »Page 46 command to display the file open dialog. Choose the note set you wish to open.

Creating new jumplist

Click on New list »Page 49 command in the Jumplist menu »Page 32. Dialog window will appear to let you fill in the name of your new jumplist. Since this name is used also as the file name (extension “.jpl” is automatically added) it must be unique, e.g. only one jumplist can have that name. If file of that name exists, Theophilos will ask you whether you want to overwrite that file.

Tip:

New jumlists may be created also by exporting Bible search results through Copier tool »Page 63 to jumplist or by merging »Page 50 several existing jumlists together.

Opening jumplist

Under the Jumplist menu »Page 32 use the Open »Page 49 command to display the file open dialog. Choose the jumplist you wish to open.

Adding new jumps to jumplist

Under the Jumplist menu »Page 32 use the Add [verse name] »Page 51 command to add currently active verse to jumplist. To make particular verse active click on it in any opened Bible version window. Then click again on the desired jumplist and add the verse to it.

Deleting jumps from jumplist

You can delete currently selected jump with the Delete item »Page 67 or Delete jump »Page 32 (pop-up menu) command.

Sorting jumplists

Jumplists can be sorted chronologically (by verse order), alphabetically (by description) or they can be unsorted. Especially the unsorted method can be useful if you wish to have the jumps in certain particular order (i.e. Bible events). In this mode each jump is added to the end of the list. Only in this mode you can move the jumps to a certain place. To do this press and hold ALT key and press the UP/DOWN arrows to move the jump to the desired place.

To have the jumplist displayed in any of these sorting methods, select it in the Jumplist/Sort by menu. To quickly sort the jumplist chronologically or alphabetically click on the header section.

The sorting method of each jumplist is saved when the jumplist is saved. Next time when you open the jumplist it will be sorted in the saved order of jumps.

Recording sound

Open any Bible version and click on verse you wish to record sound for. Use button with microphone symbol on the toolbar to start recording. Sound will be automatically attached to the active verse. To stop recording click the microphone button again or button with rectangle symbol. (Alternatively use the keyboard: press "F12" to start recording and again to stop.). If you noticed red LED light next to the microphone button was flashing while you were recording. This is to remind you of recording in progress.

BE CAREFUL WHEN RECORDING OVER LONG PERIODS OF TIME! SOUND FILES CAN GROW VERY LARGE IN SIZE POSSIBLY CONSUMING MOST OF YOUR FREE HARDDISK SPACE!

Note:

You must have soundcard properly installed and configured in your computer and microphone

attached to soundcard and working.

Sound playback

To play sound attached to verse click on that verse (making it the active verse) and click on button with speaker symbol or use "Multimedia/Verse sound »Page 51" command.

To play any sound file of supported type use "Multimedia/Open »Page 51" command to display Open dialog.

See Tips and tricks »Page 99 topic for information on how to play Bible narration and other tips.

Attaching multimedia files to verses

To attach sound and picture to any verse click on that verse (making it the active verse) and use "Multimedia/Attach media to [verse name] »Page 52" command.

Deleting attached multimedia files

A simple way to delete attached sound in Theophilos is to record over it. If the new recording is shorter than half a second Theophilos will delete resulting sound file automatically next time you attempt to play it. More complicated way is to locate the sound file yourself and delete it as you would any other file. Pictures can be deleted this way only. Please read recording tips »Page 99 to learn how to locate attached files.

Searching the Bible

To search any loaded Bible version open the Finder under Find menu »Page 32. See Finder »Page 53 topic for further details.

Searching any document

Theophilos allows you to search any opened document including those that you have created (jumplist verse descriptions may be searched as well). Find/Search this document »Page 61 command is used for this task. To switch searched document to another, activate its window and return back to this dialog.

You may also search the entire library in one step using the Finder tool. Open the Finder dialog in the Find menu and switch to Library tab. You can now choose which documents to search by selecting the document type and check marking each individual document that you wish to include in your search. Clicking the Find button will execute the search. The results are then displayed in the Navigator's Results window. The documents that contain your search criteria will be displayed there as icons with names. When you double click on the document it will open with the first found search string highlighted. You can then press F3 to continue to search that document further for more matches until no more matches are found.

Searching dictionary topics

In addition to Bible and document searches you may search dictionary and topic books topics. In any active window (jumplists are an exception) select some text you would like to find in dictionary topics (at least one must be opened). Theophilos will perform search in every opened dictionary or topic book. See Find/Find in dictionary topics »Page 60 command for more details.

Tip:

You can search all dictionaries by simply double clicking on the desired word in any open document. A special dictionary pop-up window will show where you can flip through all of your installed dictionaries to see if the topic on the selected word exists.

Note:

To search the contents of dictionary use Find/Search this document »Page 61 command instead.

Special navigation tool are Jumplists(TM). They are multifunctional lists of verse references that you can use as bookmarks for instant jumps to desired verses. Every such verse reference may have its own name or description to easily identify the verse. See Tips and tricks »Page 99 for examples how you may use them.

Printing documents on the printer

All outputs including printing are done through Copier »Page 63 tool under the Publish menu »Page 32. Use this tool to copy to clipboard, save to file or print all text including files you create.

Note:

For printing HTML documents and pictures a standard print dialog is used.

Changing language in menus

Theophilos can communicate in several languages. Select the language from the Language »Page 70 submenu in Program menu »Page 32.

Tip:

Visit our Internet web site for new and updated language files. If your language is not included in the list, you may create a new localization of Theophilos in your language. If you need any assistance feel free to contact us for more details.

Localizing Theophilos is easy to do. The language plug-in files have extension ".LDF" (language definition file) and can be found in the language folder. These files are in plain text format and are editable in a word processor.

It is highly recommended that you use Windows Notepad for editing, since other word processors may change the file format or do unwanted character conversions.

We will greatly appreciate if you send new localization plug-ins to us so we may offer them for free download to other users of Theophilos.

In the same manner you can create or edit the verse reference recognition files (.RCG). These are simply text files with Bible book names or book abbreviations to teach Theophilos recognize Bible references in library texts correctly.

Warning!

Before you attempt to edit the language plug-in modules, be sure to create a copy of the file. Do not add or remove any lines in the LDF files. Doing so may produce unpredictable results. If you do not know how to translate any line or book name, LEAVE IT IN ENGLISH! Also do not change the order of books in .LDF or .RCG files! Some modules use a particular Bible book naming convention and Theophilos may not recognize the verse links correctly if edited. It is highly recommended to create a new RCG file for your personal usage.

Changing fonts in windows

Each window can have individual font settings. To change font in specific window only use the right mouse button to click on the window and display its pop-up menu. Use "Font settings... »Page 82" command to change font. Each type of window can have their default font »Page 78 set. Default font is used every time a new window of specific type is opened. Change these settings if you use mostly fonts or character sets specific to your language. Default font settings are changed in Settings.

Note:

Some Bible versions need to have other than "western character set" setting to display correctly. If you change this setting in its window this character set will be used each time you open this version.

Please note that to view some versions you must have Multilingual support installed in Windows(TM).

Tip:

You can change fonts even in Navigator »Page 70 tool. Font assigned to Navigator tool is used also in Range window »Page 58.

Installing add-on modules

Installing add-on modules is a trivial task. Below are the installation instructions for add-on modules depending on how you obtained the files:

If you **downloaded** the file from our Internet site »Page 98, follow the instructions given there.

If you have ordered the **Theophilos Library CD »Page 96**, all add-ons are automatically accessed by the program when the CD is in your CD-ROM drive (Data path »Page 80 must point to this drive).

If you ordered **Student** or **Scholar** edition of the CD you must follow a routine for unlocking all locked add-ons »Page 81. You should have received any applicable unlock codes with your CD. If for any reason these codes are missing or you lost them contact us »Page 98 immediately and we will send these codes to you.

Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 may be ordered directly from us. Please see ordering information »Page 93 for more details.

Please visit our Internet site »Page 98 frequently for new and updated versions of Theophilos software and add-ons as these are added immediately when they become available.

Uninstalling Theophilos

To uninstall the product use standard Windows uninstall procedure: in "Add/Remove Programs" dialog select Theophilos from the list of installed programs and click on "Add/Remove" button. Theophilos will remove itself and all associated files except files that were created or added by user manually (user notes, add-ons). These files can be deleted manually.

Note:

If you have not installed the program correctly or Theophilos is not included in the list of installed programs for any reason you may simply delete the folder in which Theophilos resides. Theophilos keeps all its configuration settings in its folder. No additional files are installed on your system.

Playback of multimedia narrations from the CD

On our Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 you will find many hours of narrated Bible passages. They are all listed in a jumplist called **Greatest Bible Passages**. To be able to enjoy hearing the Word of God follow these steps:

1. Open **King James version** of the Bible from the Bible menu.
2. Under Jumplist menu, locate and click on **Greatest Bible Passages** jumplist to open it.
3. Double click on any of the listed passages. Bible text will move to selected place.
4. Click on the Bible window.
5. Press **F10** key to show **illustrations**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Verse picture command.

6. Press **F11** key to start the **playback**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Autoplay command.
7. Sit back and enjoy.

When the text of the passage is all read Theophilos will start scrolling the text automatically to next available narrated passage. To stop the playback and/or scrolling press F11 at any time.

If you have Theophilos Audio Bible CD with **Alexander Scourby's narration** you can play any verse in King James version since this text is narrated in its entirety. However, illustrations are available only for passages listed in Greatest Bible Passages jumplist.

(Please note that you must have multimedia PC to be able to hear any sound.)

HTML viewer

Theophilos is the first Bible program in the world to offer its own built-in HTML viewer compatible with HTML version 3.2. This viewer is totally independent of any other Internet browser and there is no need to have any such browser installed on the computer. On the other hand Theophilos' HTML viewer is not a replacement of your favorite Internet browser. It will only show local files, e.g. those saved on your hard disk. However if you click on the link to Internet site within the document it will open your browser automatically and follow the link. While we cannot guarantee that all HTML documents downloaded from the Internet can be opened correctly most should work without any problem, however.

We have designed a way to link HTML documents with all installed dictionaries and the verse references within the HTML text will take you directly to the right place in the Bible. HTML authors may in addition include special links »Page 90 in the HTML source to other library documents which will open automatically at specified place with a single click of the mouse. If you know how to write web pages, you are ready to go!

You can integrate HTML documents into your library by moving them anywhere within the Theophilos' data search paths and renaming their extension to TML. Theophilos will add them to the library when the program restarts.

Tip:

Move only the index pages to the data path and edit the content of these files to point to HTML documents and graphics where they are located on your hard disk. You should rename the file to something that will best describe the content as the name of the document will display in the Library. For more information about HTML please refer to some HTML language manual.

Special HTML tags

HTML viewer in Theophilos is compatible with HTML 3.2 but offers a way to link your HTML files with the rest of the library. For example you can open Easton's Bible Dictionary by clicking on a link in HTML document.

Here are some examples of such links:

`Click here`

This example shows how to create a link from the HTML document to any of the Theophilos library documents. The document will open at the specified place, in this case the "love" topic. Please note that if the HTML document with special Theophilos document link is displayed in external browser the link will not work obviously. The document you link to must be installed in the user's library or a "not found" message will appear. You must use the exact name and punctuation in the title of the document and the document's topic. The value for the document parameter can be the name of any existing topic in that document. You can link to dictionaries, commentaries, writings or TML files. If linking to TML file you must enter "none" as the topic, as there are no topics defined in the HTML documents.

`Click here` or

`Click here`

This will create a link from the HTML document to a Bible verse. The valid values can be either the name of the verse as used by Theophilos or book number, chapter and verse. The numbers must be separated by a comma.

`Click here`

This will create a link from the HTML document to "myjumplist.jpl" file. This file should be placed within the Data path or program path. You must provide any additional subdirectory path if necessary but since all paths are relative to Data path or program path you should not include the full path to the file.

How to distribute the modules

Distribution of your own modules is up to you and you may choose any preferred way. Probably the most effective is distribution over Internet but you may choose to offer your modules on diskettes or CDs as well. If you wish to distribute your modules with Theophilos application on a CD, you are required to obtain a special license from us. For more information please read the topic about Publishing and distributing your own CD products »Page 28.

Module authors may include with the module an information file which can contain anything the author wishes to inform the reader about concerning a particular module. The file must have the same file name as the module (text before the file extension) and can be of the types: TXT (plain text), DOC (plain text or MS Word), RTF (Rich Text Format) or WRI (MS WordPad). The user can display the information by right clicking on the window and selecting "Module information".

In addition you may include with your file also a short copyright notice (less than 500 bytes recommended). To do so create a short text file (preferably in MS Notepad) and give it the name of the module file with the .CPR extension. This copyright notice will display only once during the Theophilos session when the module is first opened.

Authors of Theophilos content have the option to include along with their work a special menu installation file (MIF) with the information where the module should be placed in the user's library. If the submenu does not exist it will be created. The distributed MIF file must be copied to Theophilos' program folder prior to program start and will then be automatically deleted from the user's system.

To have a module(s) installed in an appropriate place, create a text file and give it a .MIF extension. The file should contain information in the following format:

(can be bible, dictionary, commentary, writing, html or multimedia)

%0[name_of_the_first_level_submenu]
(if it does not exist it will be created)

&0[title_of_the_first_module]
(spelling and punctuation must match the document title)

&0[title_of_the_second_module]

%1[name_of_the_second_level_submenu]
(up to ten levels can be created numbered from 0 to 9)

&1[title_of_the_module]
(this will be added to the second level submenu)
```

You may add modules of different types in one MIF file or provide a separate MIF for each module.

Example:

```
#dictionary
&0Ivan Jurik
%0Ivan's dictionary of programming tips
#writing
&0Classics
&1Shakespeare
%1Hamlet
```

The above will instruct Theophilos to create "Ivan Jurik" submenu under Dictionary menu and place "Ivan's dictionary of programming tips" there. In addition "Classics" submenu will be created under Writings menu (if it does not already exist) with yet another second level submenu called "Shakespeare". Here the "Hamlet" module will be placed. The MIF file is then deleted automatically.

Note:

The MIF file is optional and does not have to be provided. Only when the author of the module wishes to install his work in a special place in the user's library is such a file necessary. If not provided the module will be installed at the top level of a particular main menu.

Tips and tricks

GENERAL

Read the Quick Guide To Theophilos 3.0

A Quick Guide To Theophilos 3.0 is a must read for every new user but we recommend even to the long time users of Theophilos to read this document and see what's new in this latest release. You can find it under the Writings menu. **Highly recommended!**

Use right mouse button extensively throughout the program.

Every window in Theophilos has its own **pop-up menu**. Many commands and options are accessible through these menus to help you use the program more effectively. See Menus and commands »Page 32 topic.

Use the Navigator to open library documents, navigate the Bible or review the library search results.

Use the Library manager to manage the constantly growing library of available add-ons.

Don't let the great number of downloadable add-ons for Theophilos overwhelm you! You can stay in the driver's seat, create submenus in your library and move documents around in them according to your preference. If you are an author and distribute your own add-on modules you can control where your work will be installed in the user's library. Just include a special menu definition file with your modules and you can create submenus on the user's system and place your modules there. For more information see How to distribute your add-ons »Page 91 topic.

Reusable windows - a new way of your desktop management.

While you can open as many windows in Theophilos as will fit on your screen, you will soon find that a cluttered desktop with many open windows will make your study difficult. Now you can reuse any open window and replace its content with any other document simply by dragging its icon from the Navigator to the text area of the window. Since every window keeps its own document and window history you can always go back to the previous document and switch between them. You can open any number of documents in any window. You can also mark any window as reusable so every time you open new document from the menu it will show in the reusable window. See Reusable windows »Page 39 for more information.

Document and window history.

Each window and document keeps its history to let you go back to any place in the document or any document which was previously shown in the window. See Document history »Page 69 and Window history »Page 69 for more details.

Browse HTML pages in Theophilos.

Theophilos features its own HTML viewer for viewing HTML content without the need of external browser. If you now how to create HTML pages you can create HTML pages with special links to the rest of Theophilos library documents accessible from your HTML documents! Read more about HTML and Theophilos »Page 90

Build your own library of add-ons for your own pleasure or commercial distribution.

Whether you are an individual user, a publishing house or large Christian organization and you have texts that you would like to work with in Theophilos, e.g. your studies, custom dictionaries or commentaries, you can make Theophilos compatible add-ons from them. You can plug them in as you do any other add-on so that you can share them over your local network with other users or distribute them as you wish. For those that want to have freedom in creating their own add-on modules for Theophilos or wish to electronically publish their works for thousands of Theophilos users we provide a full featured authoring tool called Scribe for Theophilos »Page 13. You can download an evaluation version from our Internet site »Page 98 for free.

If you wish to distribute your own CD products with Theophilos be sure to read the following topics: Theophilos advantage »Page 27, Publishing and distributing your own CD products »Page 28, Distribution of Theophilos »Page 29

Theophilos operates in two interface modes.

Depending on the content of your library (or CD content) Theophilos will use an appropriate mode to interact with the user. It will act either as a full featured Bible study application or a general literature reader. This allows publishers and users to use one application for many different purposes.

Color your Bible.

You can mark special Bible passages with different colors for easier navigation. With Theophilos we distribute KJV Bible with Christ's words in red. You can even exchange the coloring schemes with other users! For more information see Bible coloring »Page 41 topic.

Double click on any word in any document to display the dictionary or commentary pop-up.

You can lookup any word in the dictionary if you double click on any word throughout the library. If you double click on a verse reference in the Bible windows you can view all commentaries on that verse instantly!

Organize the modules on your hard disk.

Theophilos now uses in addition to main Data path and the program folder also other search paths as defined by the user. This will allow you to organize data files on your disk into individual subfolders. The paths will be searched in the following order: Theophilos program folder, main data path (usually a CD drive) and user specified folders. If more than one document of the same type is found with the same title only the first one will be added to the library. Duplicate library titles of the same type are not allowed. Files in the new data format (.T30) have priority over the old format (.DAT).

Listen and watch the preview of Bible narration in the free package.

We have added to the free copy of Theophilos a **preview of Bible narration** that you can listen to if you own a multimedia PC (with soundcard and speakers). This is only a demo of what is available on Theophilos Library CD »Page 96. In addition you must have audio compression support installed from MS Windows™ installation CD. If your computer complies with these requirements you are ready to listen to the demo:

1. Open **King James version** of the Bible from the Bible menu.
2. Go to Genesis 1:1
3. Press **F10** key to show **illustrations**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Verse picture command.
4. Press **F11** key to start the **playback**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Autoplay command.
5. Sit back and enjoy.

The passage included with the free package starts at Genesis 1:1 and ends with Genesis 2:3.

When the text of the passage is all read Theophilos will start scrolling the text automatically in attempt to find next available narrated passage. Since there are no other narrated passages available in the free package you should stop the search by pressing F11 at any time. If you liked what you heard and saw maybe you would like to order Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 with many hours of narrated passages.

How to play multimedia narrations from the CD.

On our Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 you will find many hours of narrated Bible passages. They are all listed in a jumplist called **Greatest Bible Passages**. To be able to enjoy hearing the Word of God follow these steps:

1. Open **King James version** of the Bible from the Bible menu.
2. Under Jumplist menu, locate and click on **Greatest Bible Passages** jumplist to open it.
3. Double click on any of the listed passages. Bible text will move to selected place.
4. Click on the Bible window.
5. Press **F10** key to show **illustrations**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Verse picture command.
6. Press **F11** key to start the **playback**. Alternatively you can go to Multimedia menu and click on Autoplay command.
7. Sit back and enjoy.

When the text of the passage is all read Theophilos will start scrolling the text automatically to next available narrated passage. To stop the playback and/or scrolling press F11 at any time.

If you have Theophilos Audio Bible CD with **Alexander Scourby's narration** you can play any verse in King James version since this text is narrated in its entirety. However, illustrations are available only for passages listed in Greatest Bible Passages jumplist.

(Please note that you must have multimedia PC to be able to hear any sound.)

CD version is more space efficient

CD version is recommended for systems with smaller disk capacity because it requires only approximately 4 MB of harddisk space for installation. You can save space by loading only those Bible versions you need for immediate study.

Theophilos can run in network environments

Since you may share data files (Bible versions, dictionaries, commentaries and other add-ons) over your existing network is Theophilos an ideal Bible software to use in large study groups (e.g. seminaries, universities). See more information on how to configure Theophilos for use in your network »Page 20.

Synchronization of Bible texts has two modes.

By default Smart synchronization is used. See Bible/Synchronized »Page 41 and Settings/Bible section »Page 73 topics for more details.

Font settings may be set separately for each window.

These individual settings are temporary and will be lost when window is closed. To make them permanent use default font settings instead. See Default font settings »Page 78 and Font settings »Page 82 topics for more details. We highly recommend to use Microsoft's Verdana TrueType font created specifically to address the challenges of on-screen display. If you don't have it already installed, free download is available from:

<http://www.microsoft.com/truetype/fontpack/win.htm> Here you can download Verdana for Windows 95 & Windows NT [verdan32.exe: 321KB, self installing file] – which contains extended set of characters – necessary if you plan to use Theophilos Bible translations in Central and Eastern European languages and have Win95/NT multilingual support installed.

Search all documents with simple search dialog.

Every document even your notes, topic books or Jumplists™ may be searched for text. Use "Find/Search this document »Page 61" command to search document in active window. Bible texts are searched using Finder »Page 53 tool with advanced search options.

You can search your entire library in one step.

Open the Finder dialog (Ctrl+F) and switch to Library tab. Here you can choose which documents you wish to search and set the conditions for your search. For more information see Searching any document »Page 86

If you invoke Finder or document search dialog with some text selected in active window, it will become the search string.**Add verse references to your documents for later reference and instant jumps to verse context.**

See Context of [verse name] »Page 48 topic for more details.

Jump to Bible verses instantly with "Context of" feature.

With cursor over verse reference (e.g. Jn 3:16) in dictionary, commentary, writing or your own document use "Find/Context of [verse name] »Page 48" command.

Use Copier for all outputs from Theophilos.

Content of any active window may be copied to Windows clipboard, saved to text file or printed on your printer. You may even print entire Bible or dictionary. With desired window being active invoke Copier and set your output preferences. See Copier »Page 63 topic for more details.

Use Copier to export Bible search results to Jumplist.

With Search results window active invoke Copier »Page 63 and select "Jumplist" as target. You will be asked for name of jumplist file. If this does not exist it will be created. If jumplist already exists, new verses will be appended to it. We recommend to keep reasonable number of verses in jumplists as they may become hard to navigate and thus lose their intended purpose.

Add your documents to menus for instant access.

To have your documents (notes, topic books, jumplists) easily accessible with a single mouse click you may add them to menu. Simply change the last letter in the document file's extension to "m" and it will appear in the menu. For this to work the file must be in Theophilos' program folder or in "User files path »Page 80". If you do not wish to see such file in menu anymore, change its file name extension to original.

Extensions of user files recognized by Theophilos: topic books - *.tpb, *.tpm (these are shown in menu), note sets - *.nts, *.ntm (these are shown in menu), jumplists - *.jpl, *.jpm (these are shown in menu), HTML documents - *.htm or html, *.tml (these are shown in menu). HTML documents (with TML extension) must reside anywhere within the searched paths and the program adds them to the menu upon restart.

Contact manager in Theophilos? Yes, you can use Topic books even as database of your contacts, addresses and phone numbers if you wish.**"Delete item" command works differently in each window.**

Depending on what type of window is currently active you may delete topics from topic books, jumps from jumplists or delete entire verse from Bible search results window.

Save your desktop settings to open windows automatically on startup.

Program restores desktop setup with all windows settings (position, size, content, individual font settings). You can save as many setups as you wish and name them yourself. This can

be helpful when more than one user uses the same copy of Theophilos on one computer. For more information see Save window setup »Page 75 topic.

Help us to create localization of Theophilos in your local language or create one yourself easily.

Your existing copy of Theophilos may **speak your own language**. All you have to do is translate few words and sentences from English to your language. For more information on how to do this see Localization of Theophilos »Page 87

Enhance your study experience with many available add-ons.

You may download many free add-ons from our pages or other sites on Internet or order Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 with Bible versions, dictionaries, commentaries, writings, maps, Bible narrations and much more.

Copy data files to your hard disk so you don't have to use CD at all.

If you wish to eliminate use of CD for some reason you may copy some or all data files to your computer harddisk. After normal successful installation process copy selected data files (*.t30 and *.dat) to Theophilos program folder. We do not recommend this since data files can consume very large amount of free space on your hard disk. This operation is recommended only for advanced users. Please read also Warranty and License Agreement »Page 15.

Use your mouse wheel in document windows.

If you have MS Windows 98 or higher installed you can enjoy a built-in support for mice with wheels in Theophilos.

JUMPLISTS™

Try our sample jumplists.

We have provided several sample jumplists to show you how they can be used. There are some available directly under the "Jumplist »Page 32" menu for ease of access. This is to show you that you can put files to menus or remove them at your will. See tips in the beginning of this section to learn how to perform this task. Please note that there are many jumplists not shown in the menu and you can access them by the "Jumplist/Open... »Page 49" command in Theophilos' folder. You may rename, modify or add to these jumplists your own jumps freely. Please check our web site »Page 98 for more jumplists.

Use Jumplists™ for instant access to verses and playback of multimedia files attached to them.

You may view jumplists as multifunctional bookmarks. Double click on jumplist entry will get you instantly to corresponding place in the Bible. If you have "Verse sound »Page 51" and "Verse picture »Page 52" features turned on multimedia files attached to such verse will be played as well. If you combine this feature with data projector you will add power to your presentation and your audience will stay awake as music or audio recording is played and pictures are shown. Your study group will not be the same again!

Create special topical jumplists.

Whatever topic you are studying jumplists will help you keep all relevant verses easily accessible from one window. We recommend to create separate jumplists for each group of related verses as this will help you keep your study organized.

Name every verse reference with custom text.

To improve your navigation even more you may give every entry in your jumplist an individual name or description. Theophilos by default uses first few letters from the verse to create automatic descriptions, but you have the choice to edit them to display your own text.

Sort your jumplist entries.

You may sort each jumplist either chronologically (default) or alphabetically by description. Click on the column header to choose desired sorting method instantly. Or have the jumplist show in unsorted order. In this mode you can move the individual jumps by holding the ALT key and pressing the UP and DOWN arrow keys.

Copy, save or print complete verse texts from Jumplists™ through Copier using Bible version of your choice.

You may print your jumplists in more than one way. You have the choice to print entire jumplist with descriptions as displayed in jumplist window or print complete text of verses. You decide which Bible version to use in Copier dialog »Page 63. If you wish to copy only single verse use Copy verse »Page 66 command. Jumplist will use text from currently active version (last selected). Copy »Page 65 command will copy selected jumplist entry to let you paste it in another opened jumplist window.

Adjust verse column width in Jumplists™ to exact value.

Verse column width may be adjusted visually from Settings/Other documents »Page 73 dialog. Using the arrows beside the edit box, columns of all open jumplists are adjusted simultaneously. All jumplists will use this value as they are opened.

MULTIMEDIA

Play your favourite tunes.

Theophilos supports sound files also in MPEG layer 3 format (*.mp3) for playback besides Wave (*.wav) files. As this format becomes popular for its supreme compression ratios without decreased playback quality many files are available on the Internet with many popular music titles. You may open and play these files directly from Theophilos or attach them to verses.

Add your pictures and sounds to Multimedia menu for instant access.

You may add your own custom pictures and sounds to this menu very easily. Simply copy such files to respective folders ("sound" or "picture" - create them in Theophilos program folder if they do not already exist). Next time the program starts they will be added to this menu. You can even add motion video files in AVI and MPG formats. We recommend this feature to add your own maps or charts.

Attach your sound and picture files to every verse in the Bible.

Every verse in the Bible may have one sound and one picture file attached. These are played automatically when "Verse sound »Page 51" and "Verse picture »Page 52" toggles are on and such verse becomes the top verse. Currently only Windows Bitmap (BMP) and JPEG (JPG) formats are supported for pictures. See Multimedia/Attach media »Page 52 topic for more information.

Record your own Bible narration in your own voice and language without leaving Theophilos or use third party recording software.

If you have soundcard properly installed and configured in your computer and you have also microphone attached you may create Bible narration in your own voice or simply use this feature for personal audio notes to every verse in the Bible. Open any Bible version and click on verse you wish to record sound for. Use button with microphone symbol on the toolbar to start recording. Sound will be automatically attached to the active verse. To stop recording click the microphone button again or button with rectangle symbol. (Alternatively use the keyboard: press "F12" to start recording and again to stop.). If you noticed red LED light next to the microphone button was flashing while you were recording. This is to remind you of recording in progress.

BE CAREFUL WHEN RECORDING OVER LONG PERIODS OF TIME! SOUND FILES CAN GROW VERY LARGE IN SIZE POSSIBLY CONSUMING MOST OF YOUR FREE HARDDISK SPACE!

You may use also third party software of your choice to do your recording but you should be aware of supported file formats and naming scheme of files in Theophilos. Theophilos uses following structure for locating attached files. Sound files are located in subfolder named "sound" in Theophilos program folder. Next Bible books folders are following with book numbers padded with zero as their name (two digits). Similarly chapter subfolders use their numbers as name and are also padded with zeros (must be three digit number). Files themselves are on the verse level with same naming scheme (three digits with zeros). Example: sound for John 3:16 will be located in "sound\43\003\016.wav". Good news is that you do not have to go through such difficulties but simply name your files as you wish and then attach them to verses from Theophilos interface. Theophilos will create a copy of your file and will correctly rename it and place it to the correct folder. Picture files are located in subfolder named "picture" and use identical naming convention. (Advanced users)

Listen to the Bible while you work with your favourite applications.

If you have Theophilos Library CD »Page 96 or Theophilos Audio Bible CD with Bible narrations or have recorded your own you can now listen to it in the background. Simply click the Autoplay »Page 52 command while in Bible window and minimize Theophilos application. You can now do your work while listening to the Word of God.

Create and run impressive multimedia presentations of God's Word to attract children and adult audiences.

Reading some of the above tips you probably already have the idea of what multimedia is about. You can now put it to work in your home or church to make your teaching more compelling then ever.

Use several versions of your own audio notes or narrations.

Theophilos locates sound files in subfolder named "sound". To create second set of sound attachments rename this folder. When you wish to use the first set again rename the folder back to "sound" again.

Change the opening music theme.

Theophilos plays file "intro.wav" by default when the "Play sound on startup »Page 78" is checked. This file can be found in "sound" directory. If you rename other sound file to this name and copy to this directory, program will play this file next time it starts. Alternatively if you are an advanced user you may change the name of the file to be played in the "theophil.ini" file.

Conserve harddisk space with optimal quality/size recording setting.

BE AWARE that sound files may grow significantly in size possibly consuming most of your free harddisk space. Therefore consider a compromise between sound quality and efficiency in your recordings. You may adjust this setting in Settings/Multimedia »Page 73 dialog.

Conserve harddisk space with third party sound compression software.

Sound files can take up significant amounts of space on your harddisk. Theophilos has built-in support for playback of MPEG layer 3 compressed sound files. You must install Audio compression support from MS Windows™ installation CD if you wish to use compressed Wave (MS ADPCM) files for playback. We recommend compressing your recordings with third party compression software to help reduce free space consumption. For advanced users only.

Delete unwanted sounds and pictures.

A simple way to delete attached sound in Theophilos is to record over it. If the new recording

is shorter than half a second Theophilos will delete resulting sound file automatically next time you attempt to play it. More complicated way is to locate the sound file yourself and delete it as you would any other file. Pictures can be deleted this way only. Please read recording tips to learn how to locate attached files.
